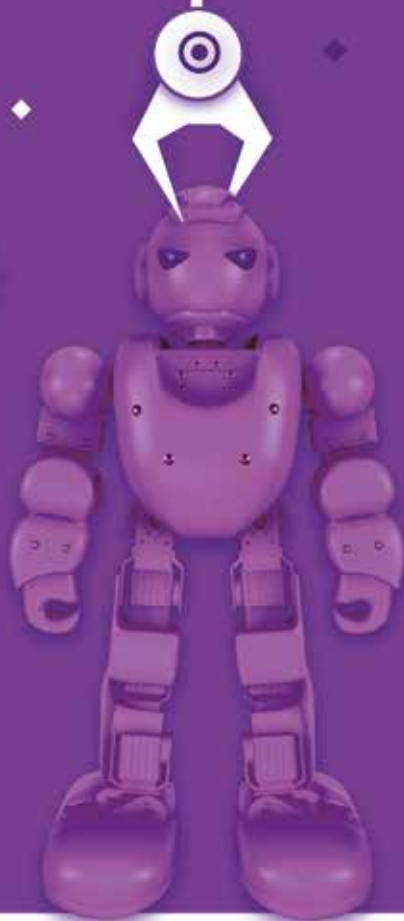

AN EXTRAORDINARY DESTINATION

Abu Dhabi Emirate

Abu Dhabi is steeped in history, with evidence of human settlement stretching back 7,000 years, and an emphasis on conserving and promoting the heritage, culture, and traditions of the emirate is an integral chapter in the emirate's story. While preserving the past, this is a place which shapes the future. The stunning development of the emirate supports its evolution into a world-class, sustainable destination. Abu Dhabi is blessed with distinct diversity of terrain, people, and traditions and has 700 kilometres of stunning coastline, beautiful natural islands, awe-inspiring deserts, bountiful oases, towering mountains, and vibrant cities for you to explore.

Abu Dhabi is a destination of near year-round blue skies, white sand beaches and a modern cosmopolitan capital city lifestyle which retains the richness of Arabian culture. Abu Dhabi city, and the wider emirate, is a destination for travellers who seek an authentic experience and wish to immerse themselves in a resilient, and largely unchanged, culture.



Culture

Archaeological discoveries suggest that fishing communities were living on the region's coast thousands of years ago. Once a leading exporter of pearls, Abu Dhabi gradually turned into a trading centre and, by the end of the 19th century, had gained a reputation for its coastal souks. The discovery of oil in 1958 had a dramatic effect on the economy. Now, Abu Dhabi brings together old world charm and cosmopolitan chic in a clean and safe city.

Helpful Tips

Walking around

Pedestrians should always observe the “walking man” signs at crossings and use the bridges and underpasses on major roads when available. It is not the custom for vehicles to stop for pedestrians on crossings without lights, so always wait for a sufficient gap in traffic before stepping out.

Language

Arabic is the official language of the UAE. English is the second language, and you will find that everything you need is almost always in both languages. English is also widely spoken but if you try to learn a few Arabic words and phrases it will be much appreciated.

Money

The currency of the UAE is the dirham, which is pegged to the United States dollar at the rate of Dh3.67 to \$1. Currency exchanges can be found at the airport and in most shopping malls and will generally offer a better rate of exchange than banks, especially for larger amounts. Please note that shopkeepers and taxi drivers may have problems giving change for any bank note above Dh100. Be aware that the smallest note dispensed from an ATM is Dh100.

Tipping in the UAE is optional but appreciated. You will find a service charge already added to your bill in hotels and hotel restaurants, but this often is not given to the restaurant staff. For taxis and restaurant staff, around 10 per cent is sufficient but no offence will be taken if you do not tip.

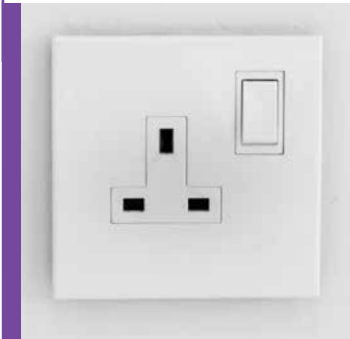
The international code for the UAE is +971, followed by the number, but dropping the first digit.

Most hotels offer free Internet for guests, as do shopping malls.

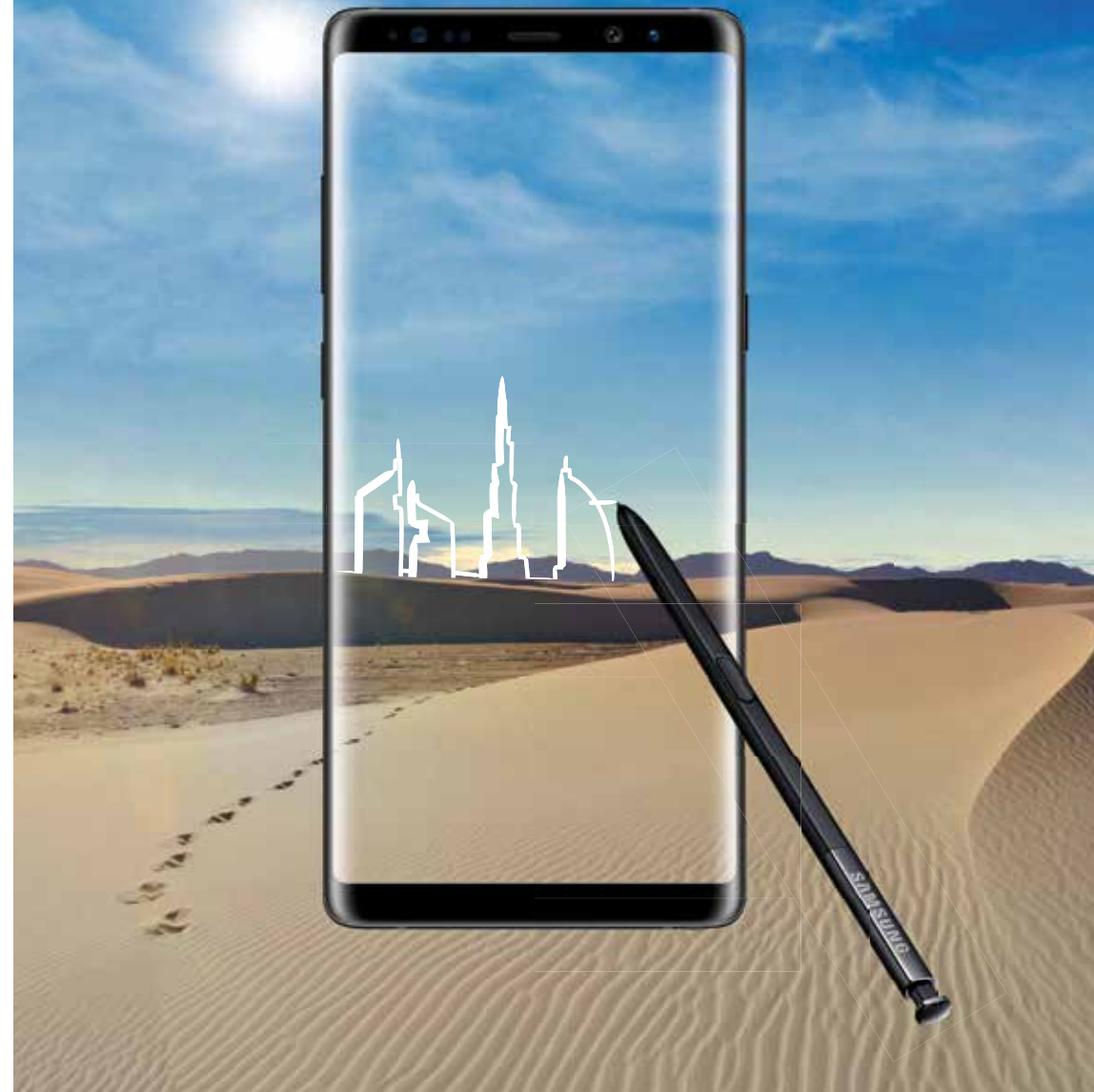

Cultural Do's and Dont's

Dress code is not legally enforced, so observing it is just a matter of simple courtesy to your hosts. It is generally appreciated if women wear skirts that are no more than a couple of inches above the knee, and tops that cover the shoulders. Men should also keep their shoulders covered and wear shorts that come to the knee. Tattoos are best kept covered in public places.

Alcohol is forbidden to Muslims as part of their religion, but the UAE permits it for others. Alcohol is sold in hotel bars and restaurants but not in other venues, with a few exceptions. You must be 21 and older to drink and it is a good idea for younger visitors to carry proof of age even if they are legally allowed alcohol.

Using illegal drugs in the UAE, bringing them into the country, and buying and selling them will all have extremely serious consequences.

Using offensive gestures and hand signals to other drivers is to be avoided and may result in a complaint to the police and possible prosecution.

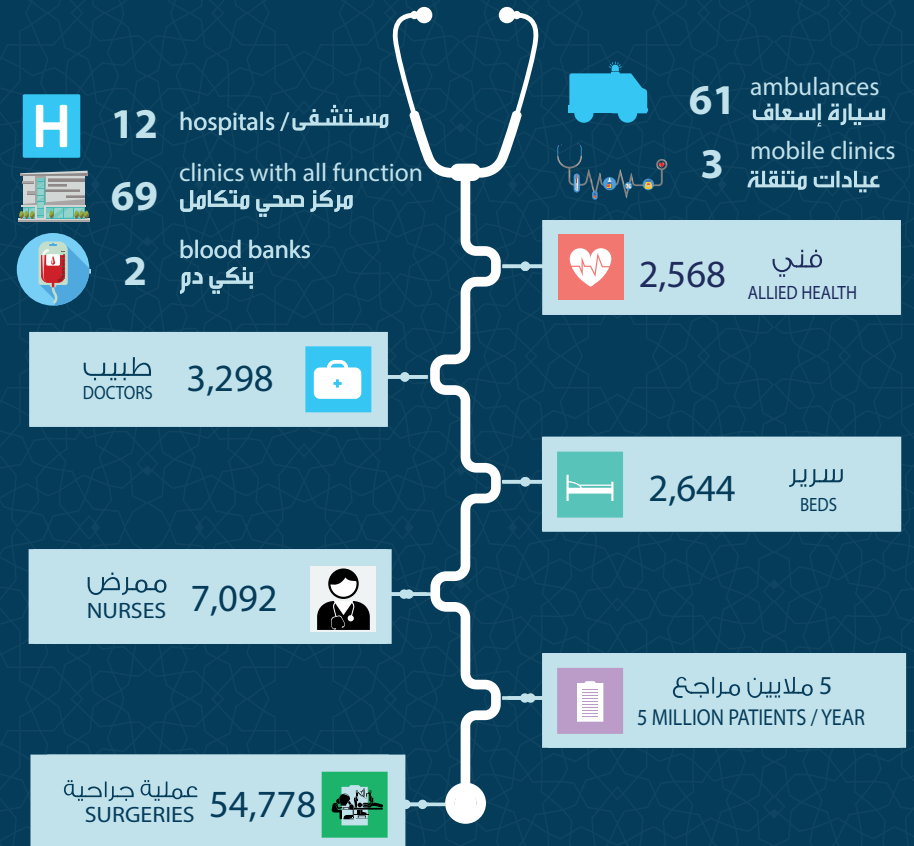
Couples are expected not to be over physically demonstrative in public, but holding hands is acceptable. In general, all public signs of affection should be avoided.

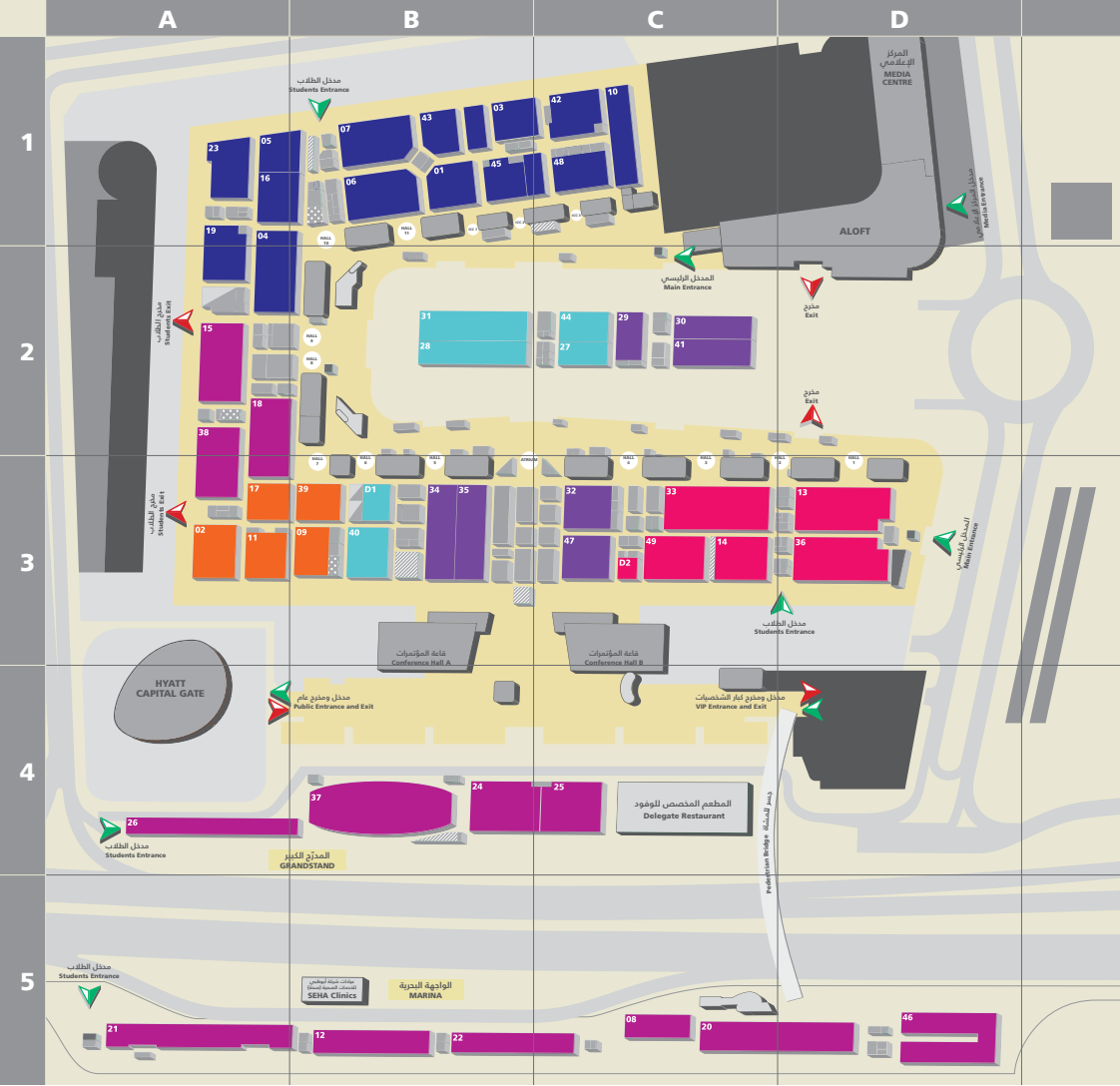

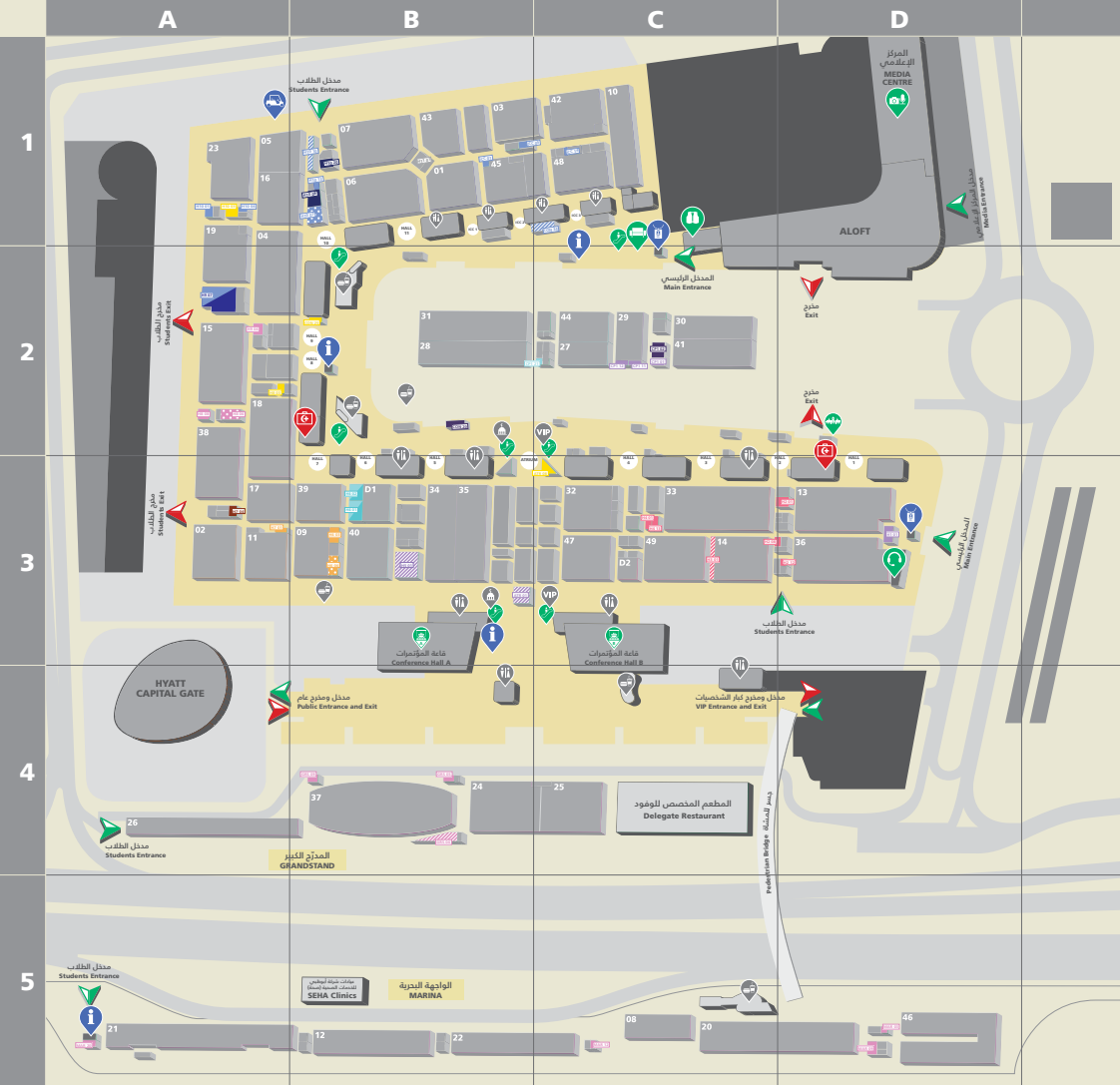

ADNEC INFORMATION

Safety and Security Procedures

General Health, Safety, and Environment awareness is vital in the planning and implementation of the Competition to ensure a healthy and safe event.

Every effort will be made to:

- Identify hazards and related risks
- Inform those who need to know about any potential hazards
- Control or reduce the risk of those hazards as far as is reasonably practicable

Safety will be integral to event activities. Together we can create a positive safety culture and ensure a successful event, with on-going proven practices. All accredited personnel involved in the event must ensure Health and Safety for themselves and those around them. If Health, Safety, and Environment policies and UAE regulations are not respected, Competitors will be instructed to stop work to ensure that the facilities are assessed and made safe.

All accredited personnel involved in the event must immediately report all dangerous behaviour, defects, or faults affecting the facilities to one or more of the following responsible persons: Skill Competition Manager, Chief Expert, Workshop Manager or a member of the organizing team.

SECURITY

Security guards will be appointed at different locations throughout the halls and around the venue to secure those areas during build-up, competition days and breakdown.

If you need the police while at ADNEC, please call the security control room (+971 2 406 4444) first.



First Aid

For First aid or emergency medical attention (ambulance) please call security control room Ext: 4444 (or +971 2 406 4444 if dialing from a mobile or outside line). Their knowledge can save vital time in the event of an emergency.

Please state clearly:

- The name of the skill competition
- The location and the number of the skill competition or stand that is nearest to the incident
- Your name
- The type of accident or emergency, e.g. heart, broken limb
- Stay with the casualty until help arrives

Operating hours will be consistent with the venue opening times during the Competition days. For build-up and breakdown days, the standard operating hours are 08:00 to 18:00.

FIRST AID AND EMERGENCY EVACUATION

- First aid kits and evacuation plans will be available in every workshop
- First aid staff will patrol the halls throughout the event
- Evacuation and emergency exits must be kept clear at all times
- Corridors, paths, and exits must not be blocked or obstructed by objects
- It is the duty of each person to familiarize themselves with the escape and rescue routes and to obey directions in the event of an evacuation. Fire service access routes must be kept clear
- Doors on escape routes and emergency exits must not be locked during the preparation days, familiarization, and the Competition days

All accredited personnel involved in the Competition are required to assist in the first-aid process if an accident occurs. This assistance must be appropriate and prompt, e.g. calling emergency services or an ambulance. An Emergency and Evacuation Plan will be available in the workshop.

If an Expert or Competitor takes medication or requires regular medical supervision, e.g. adrenalin auto injection, insulin, heart tablets, the Chief Expert and the Competitor's Team Leader and Expert must be informed before preparation and familiarization commences. Details of medical conditions must be documented using the Action Plan for Anaphylaxis or Asthma Action Plan forms provided to the Technical Delegates. Action Plans for Anaphylaxis must be displayed on the wall of the Workshop Manager's office. This form is exempt from privacy requirements.

The Workshop Manager, Skill Competition Manager, or Chief Expert and the Competitor's Team Leader, Technical Delegate, and/or Expert must be told immediately if any Expert or Competitor becomes ill or has an accident.

Arrival Process – All Other Delegates

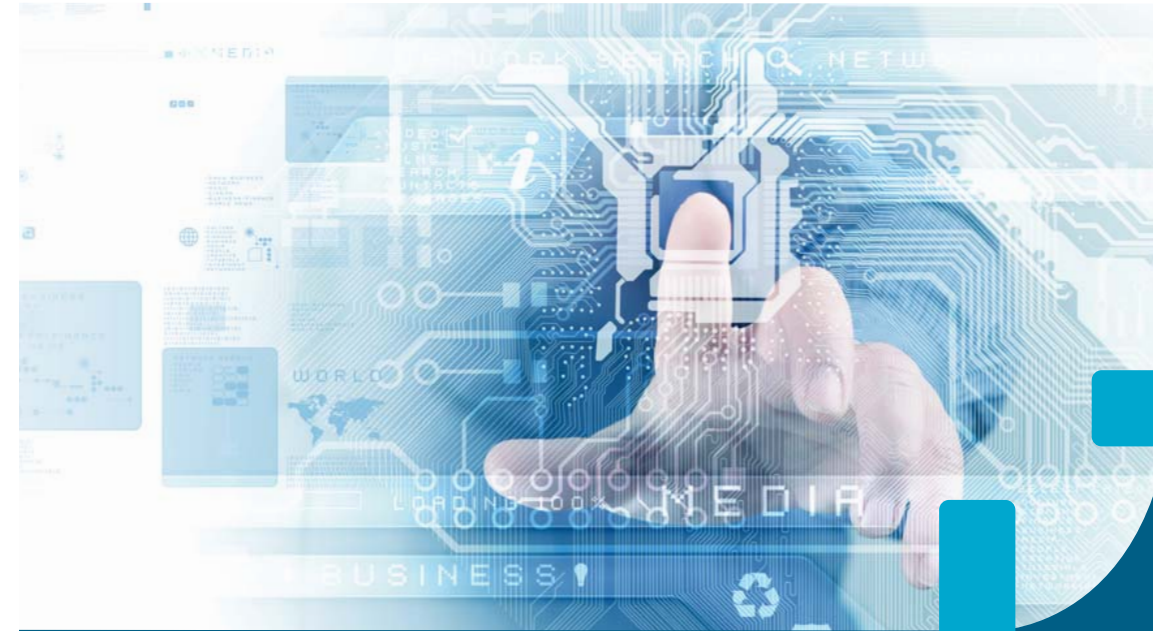
Buses for all other delegates will leave from the hotels at 18:00 to provide enough time to arrive at du Arena and find your seats in the allocated area.

Public Transportation

BY TAXI

Abu Dhabi's taxi network is operated by TransAD. To book a taxi through TransAD, call 600 53 53 53. If you are travelling by taxi from Abu Dhabi Airport, ADNEC is approximately 20 minutes away. From the Abu Dhabi Corniche, ADNEC is just 15 minutes away. Taxis are regularly available near ADNEC Gate A, at the Aloft Hotel entrance, as well as opposite the Premier Inn and Capital Centre Arjaan. Taxis only accept cash; drivers may not be able to provide change for 100dhs notes.
